CHINA AND THE WEST BEFORE THE "SILK ROUTES": CULTURAL CONTACTS, 2000-100 BC

THURSDAY, 28 APRIL, 2016, 6 PM C.T.

Even before China's expansion into Central Asia under the Han dynasty, continental East Asia was lodged in a complex web of long-distance relationships. Recent archaeological discoveries suggest that these transcontinental contacts may have exerted a greater impact than was previously realized on the development of what we like to think of as "Chinese civilization." Aside from pointing out art-historical connections, this lecture will attempt to delineate the economic framework in which these interactions took place.

Lothar von Falkenhausen is Professor of Chinese Archaeology and Art History and Associate Director of the Cotsen Institute of Archaeology at UCLA, where he has taught since 1993. Educated at Bonn, Peking, Kyoto, and Harvard, Falkenhausen is interested in large interdisciplinary and historical issues on which archaeological materials can provide significant new information.
